柴可夫斯基第三交響曲盡是朝氣十足的歡快舞蹈—包括標題的波蘭舞曲—讓人賞心悅目。只是如果單聽音樂，誰也不會想到這首交響曲寫於作曲家迷失自我之時。噴泉在羅馬擁有悠久的歷史，雷史碧基用音符描繪的四幅圖畫，記載了這個不朽城市不同時份的四個噴泉，是作曲家向這種結合潔淨的水與雕塑的偉大建築的最高致敬。依貝克的長笛協奏曲是一首火花四射的炫技作品，充滿幽默感之餘又帶點爵士味，擔任獨奏的是熱力迫人的碧芝莉妮。

Tchaikovsky's third symphony was composed at a time of deep self-doubt, but one would never guess it from the music. Infused with sunlight and cheerful dances, including the polonaise which gave it its name, this symphony is full of delight. Respighi's *Fountains of Rome* depicts four great monuments; a tribute to that city's historical obsession with pure water and sculpture. Respighi chose to depict each fountain at a different time of day – as much a picture of the Immortal City itself as of its fountains. Ibert's Flute Concerto, a dazzling showpiece for our soloist Marina Piccinini, bubbles away with good humour and just a hint of jazz.

艾爾加可能也想不到，他和好友鋼琴鍵上的猜謎遊戲，後來會變成他的謎語變奏曲。極愛出謎的他，由始至終沒有揭開謎底，然而曲中高貴的音樂，卻是送給親愛友伴的最佳心意。布拉姆斯的海頓變奏曲一樣成謎，莊重的主題被後世發現原來和海頓無關。無人知道旋律源自何方，布拉姆斯卻能將這旋律幻化成多首情感迥異的變奏曲，就是這份能耐，讓此曲成為他的成名之作。兩個謎題中間，是兩首拉威爾寫於二十年代的鋼琴協奏曲，作曲家的睿智和巴黎爵士的脈搏隨處可聞。為左手而作的協奏曲是專為維特根斯坦——一位於第一次世界大戰失去右手的鋼琴家而創作的。合上眼，你不會想像到這是一隻手彈出來的，是對獨奏家一項重大的挑戰。G大調協奏曲輕鬆愉快、精彩絕倫，讓它閃耀生輝的是指揮佛斯特和鋼琴家薛默特。

Elgar started his Enigma Variations by accident, doodling at the piano to depict his best friends. A great lover of riddles, he never let on what the Enigma theme was. But instead, we have some of his noblest music – a fitting tribute to an artist's dearest companions. No less enigmatic are Brahms' Haydn Variations. Their stately theme, it was later discovered, is not by Haydn at all. No one really knows the origin of the tune, but Brahms uses it to weave together a huge range of emotions. Between the riddles are Ravel's two piano concertos. Dating from the 1920s, they're full of the wit and pulse of Parisian jazz. The concerto for left hand was written for Paul Wittgenstein, who had lost an arm in the Great War. It's a thrilling challenge for the soloist: close your eyes and you won't believe it's for one hand only. Its companion piece, the Concerto in G, light-hearted and brilliant, is bound to sparkle under the guidance of Lawrence Foster and soloist Hüseyin Sermet.
